1 Tasks description

After the running of the full training experimentation, results will be analysed and used to optimise the different modules with regards to surveys distributed during the experimentation.

In the wake of task 5.4, ABA will be in charge of receiving trainees' and trainers' surveys on the experimentation and will write a report including remarks and advices on potential improvements.

2 Full training experimentation for trainees

The full-scale training of the material has been carried out at national scale in Austria, Italy, France and the Netherlands. A total of 231 learners have been involved in this training (deliverable 5.1). After the participation, each student was invited to fill out a satisfaction survey on the material presented in the course. The satisfaction survey has been prepared by INFOR ELEA within the quality assurance system with the collaboration of training centres. From the 231 learners involved in the training, a total of 174 surveys could be collected.

2.1 Quality assessment - satisfaction survey

After completing the full-scale training, students were able to fill out a survey considering their satisfaction of the learning course with the possibility of reporting eventual remarks or improvements. The satisfaction surveys were translated previously in each partners language (Italian, French, German and Dutch) and then being presented throughout Google Form® allowing the students to attend the surveys under the following web addresses:

The survey itself consisted in 11 questions allowing an evaluation of the course in terms of Relevance, Completeness, Accuracy and Reliability.

2.2 Content of the satisfaction survey

As previously noted, the quality assessment was fulfilled by answering 11 questions previously prepared by the partners and presented throughout Google Form®. The questions in the survey could be answered according to the following legend, with the possibility of adding additional remarks.

The subjects in question enrolled in the student survey were the following:

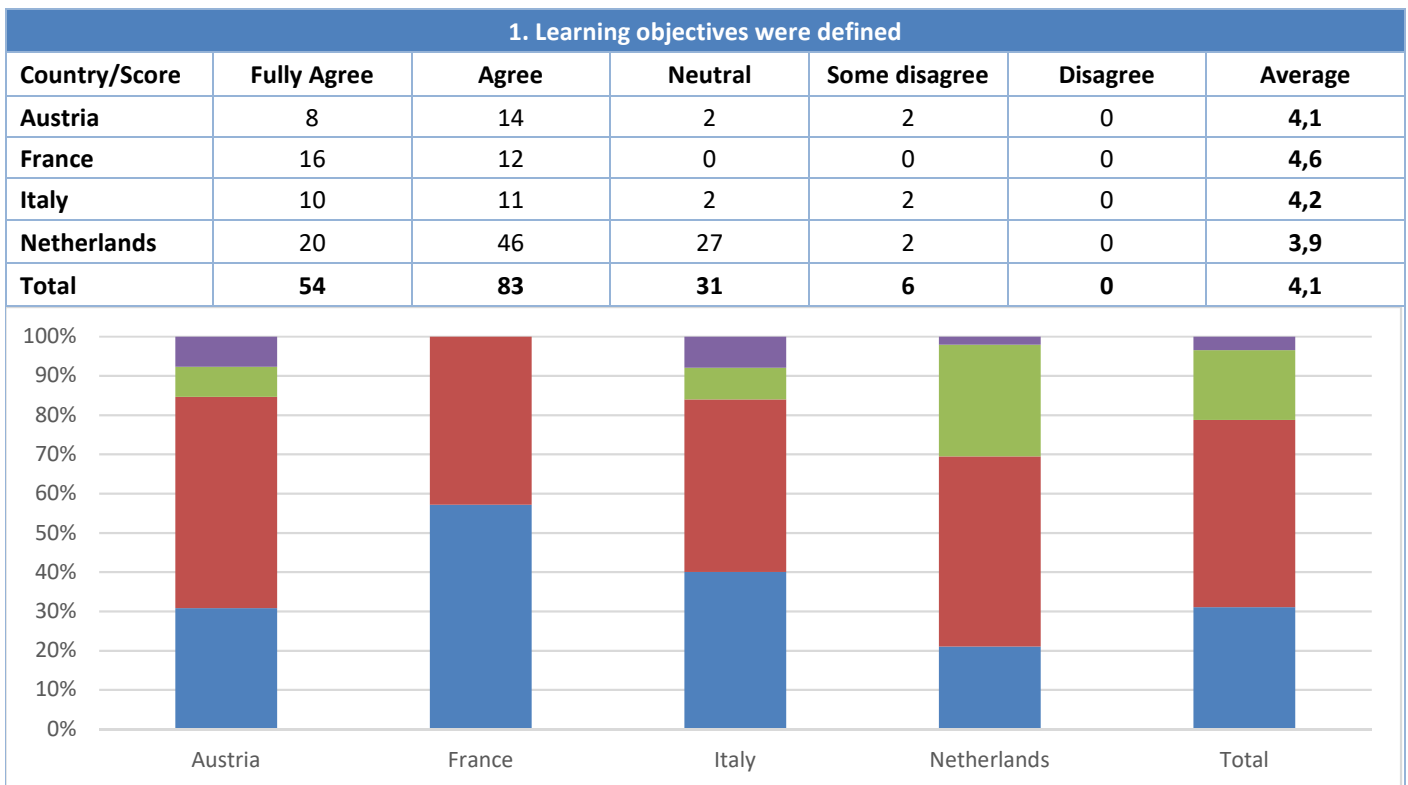
1. The learning objectives were defined.
2. The course content was consistent with the objectives.
3. I think I can apply the new skills in my future job.
4. The format of the learning content was appropriate.
5. The amount of time to complete this course was appropriate.
6. The learning material was accessible.
7. The visual design of the course materials was appropriate.
8. The overall difficulty of this course was appropriate.
9. The questions asked in the assignments were appropriate.
10. The tutoring activity was adequate.
11. I'm satisfied with this course.

3 Results of the survey

In the following part the results of the 174 surveys collected will be presented for each question considering the national and total outcome. In order to be able to quantify the results, each possible answer was graded, reaching from 5 (fully agree) to 1 (disagree).

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3.1 Results collected

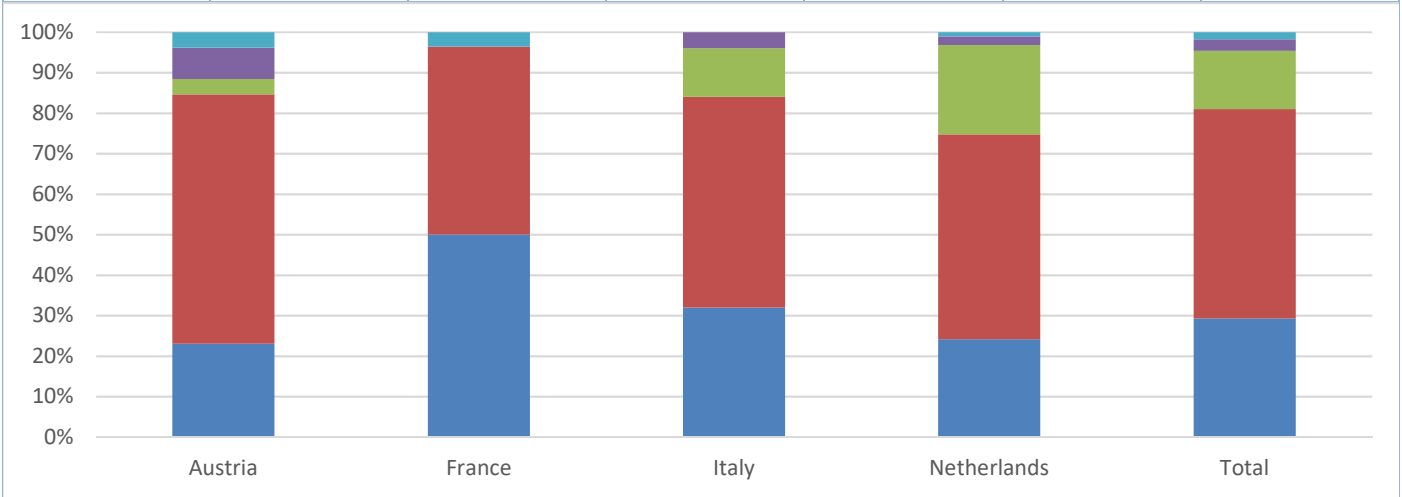


Considering the definition of the learning objectives, the results from the student survey ranged from 3,9 (Netherlands) to 4,6 (France). In total the learning objectives can be graded as well defined (score 4,1).

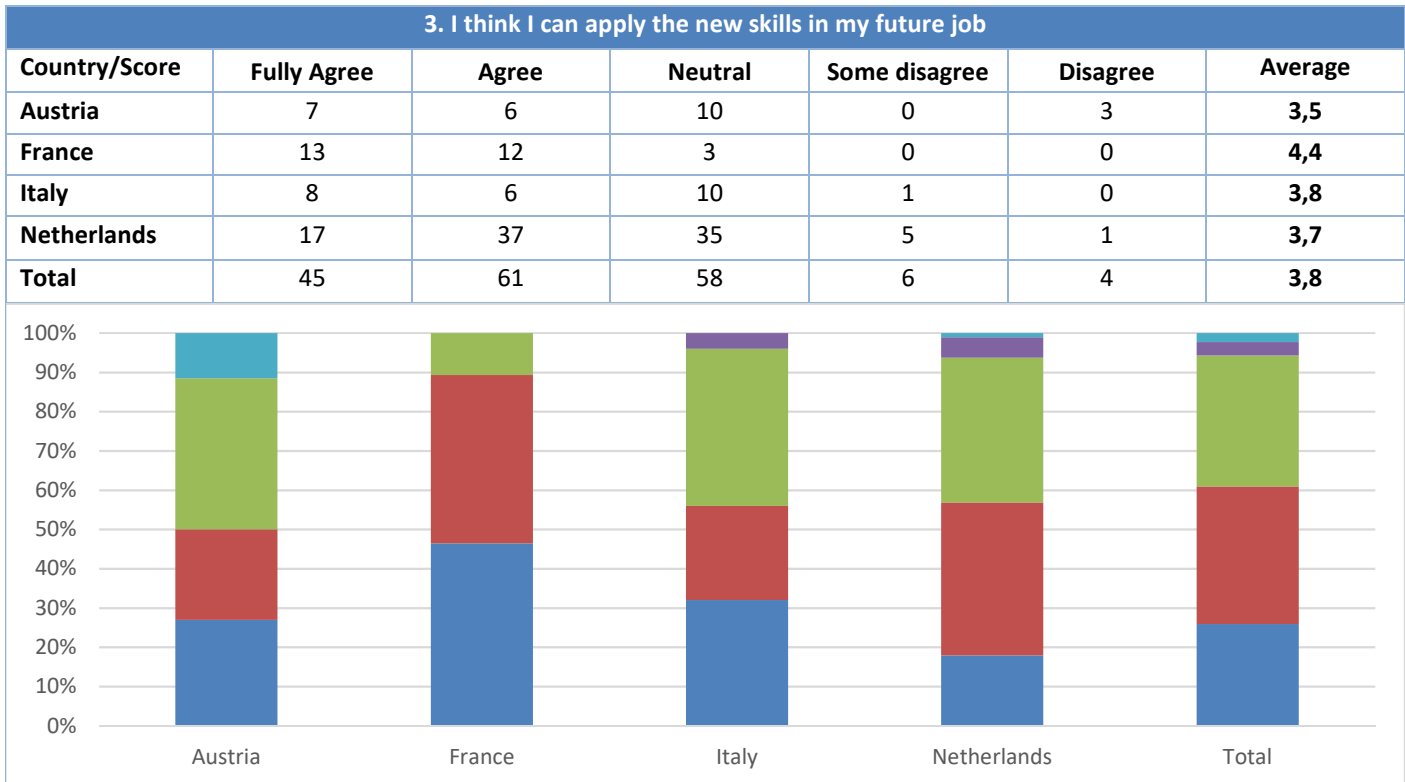
2. The course content was consistent with the objectives

Considering the consistency of the course content regarding the objectives, the results from the student survey ranged from 3,9 (Netherlands, Austria) to 4,4 (France). In total the course content can be graded as well consistent with the objectives (score 4,0).

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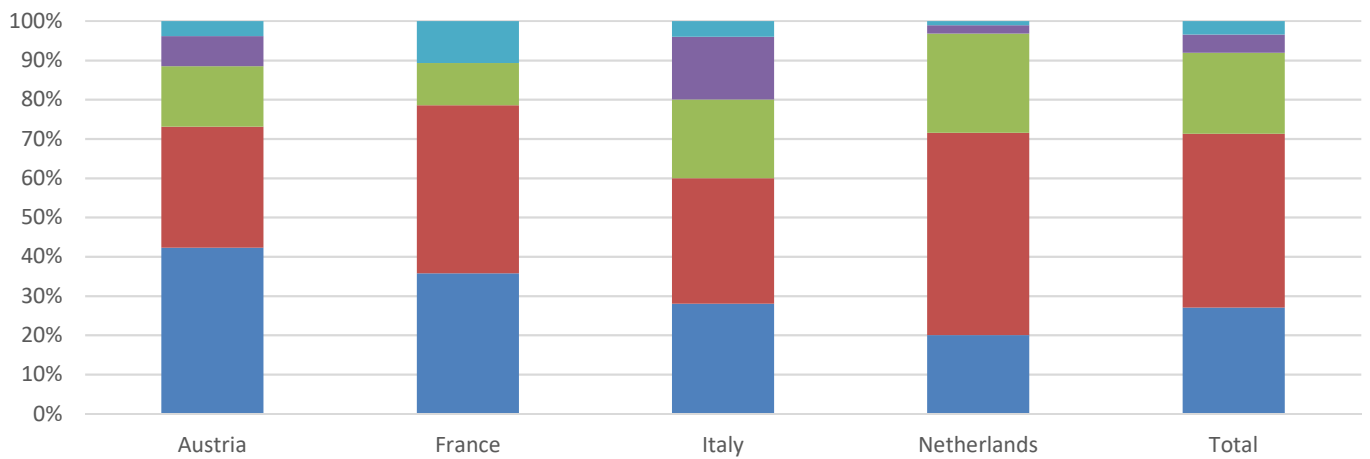


Considering the probable appliance of the new skills in a future employment, the results from the student survey ranged from 3,5 (Austria) to 4,4 (France). In total the new skills learned during the course are likely to be applied in the future employment (score 3,8).

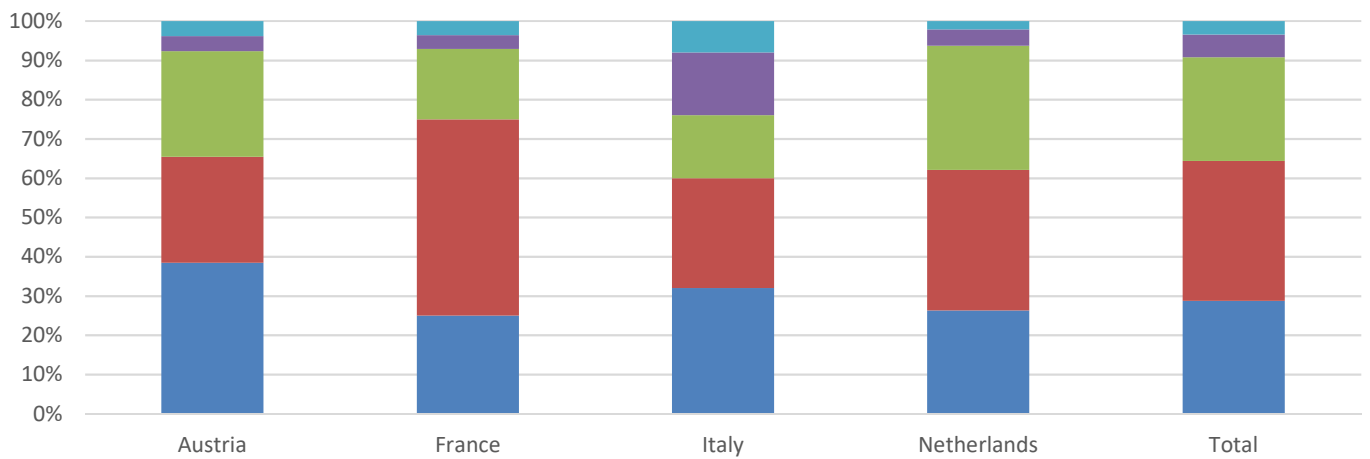

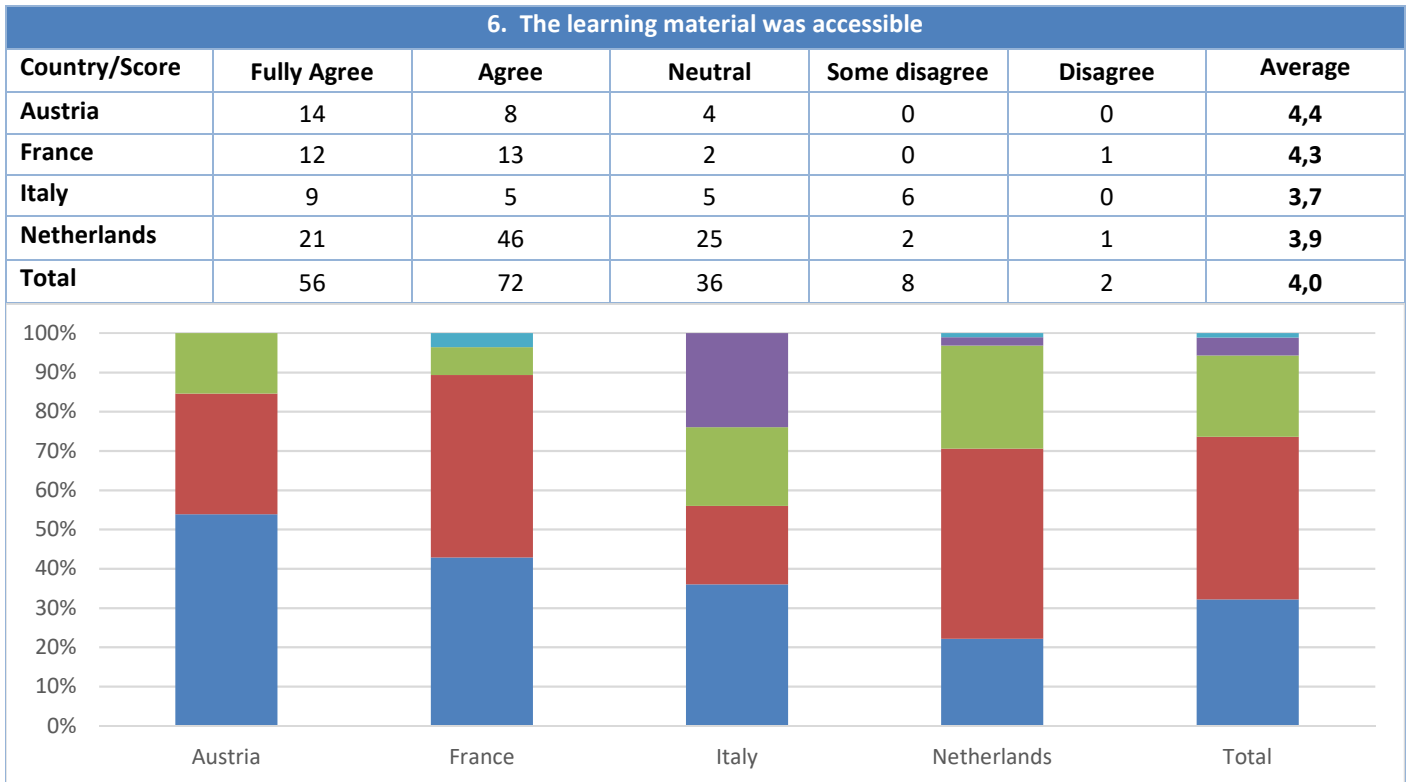
5. The amount of time to complete this course was appropriate

Considering the amount of time provided to complete the course, the results from the student survey ranged from 3,6 (Italy) to 3,9 (Austria, France). In total the amount of time provided to complete the course can be seen as well appropriate (score 3,8).

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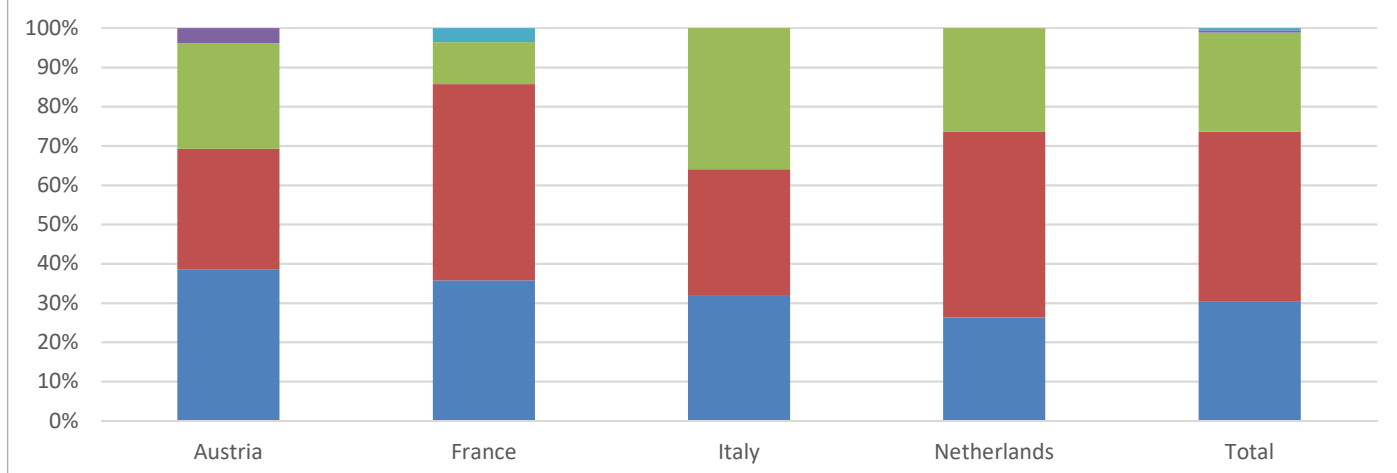

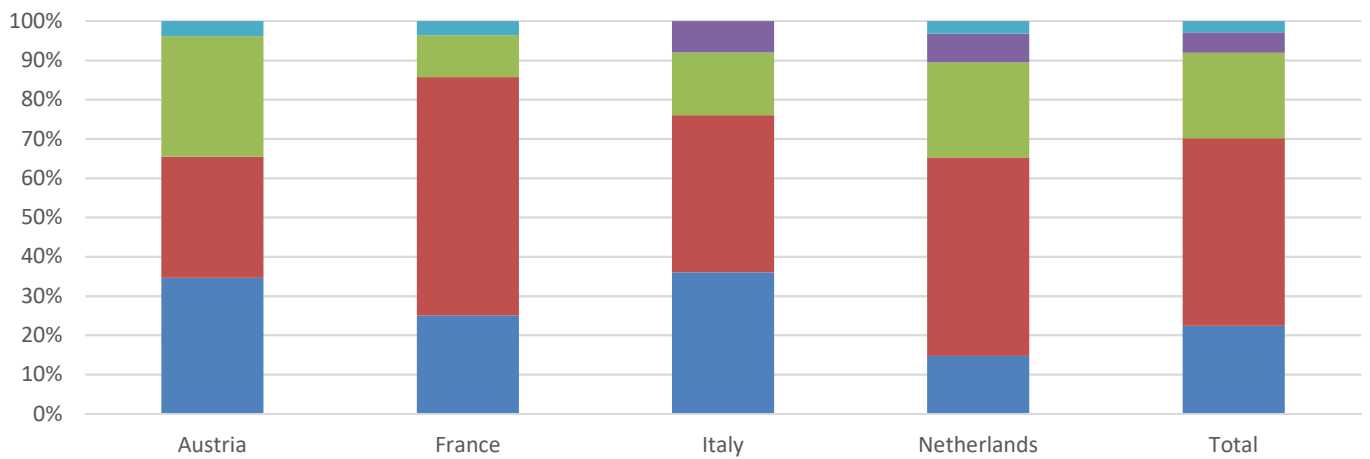

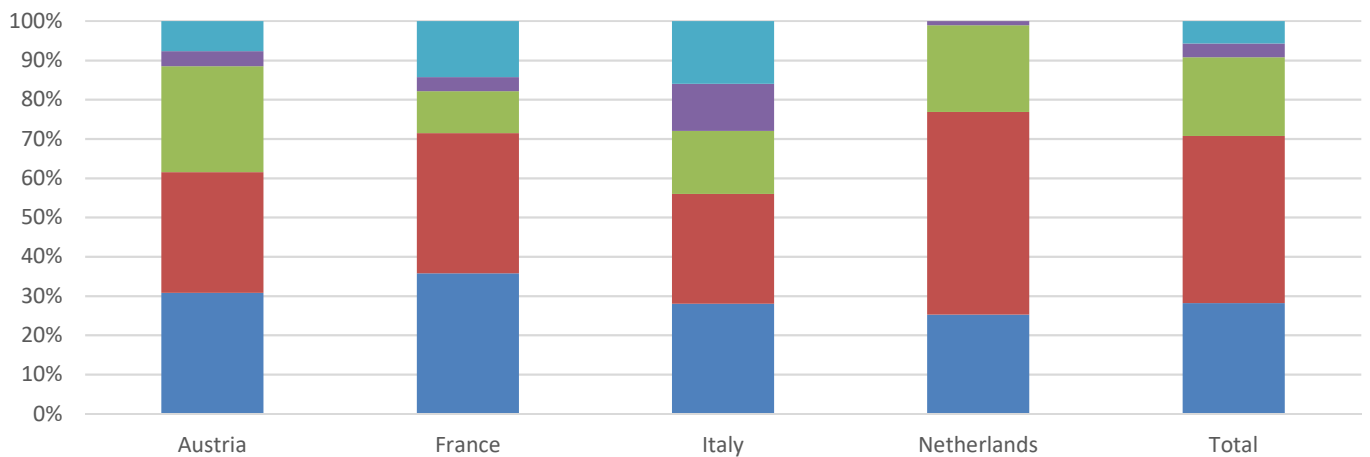

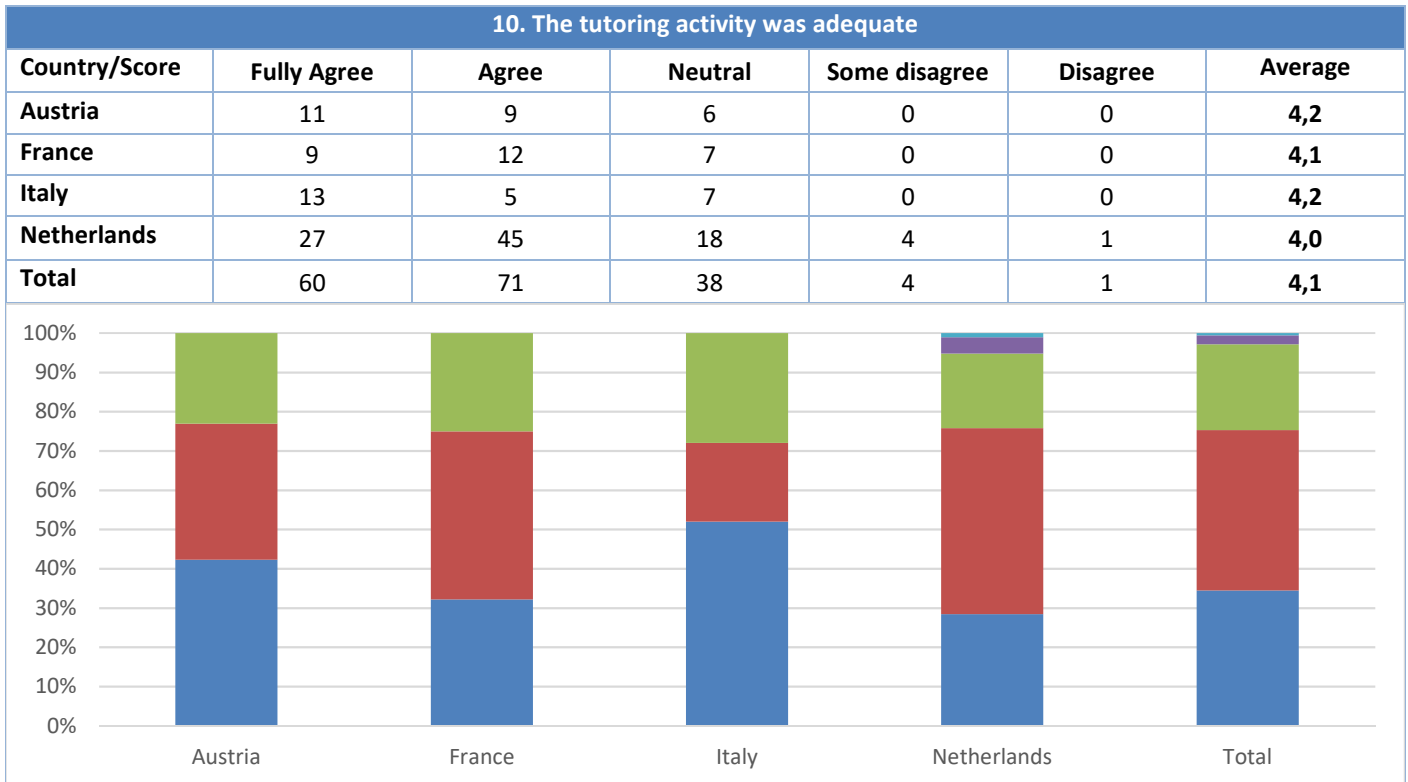

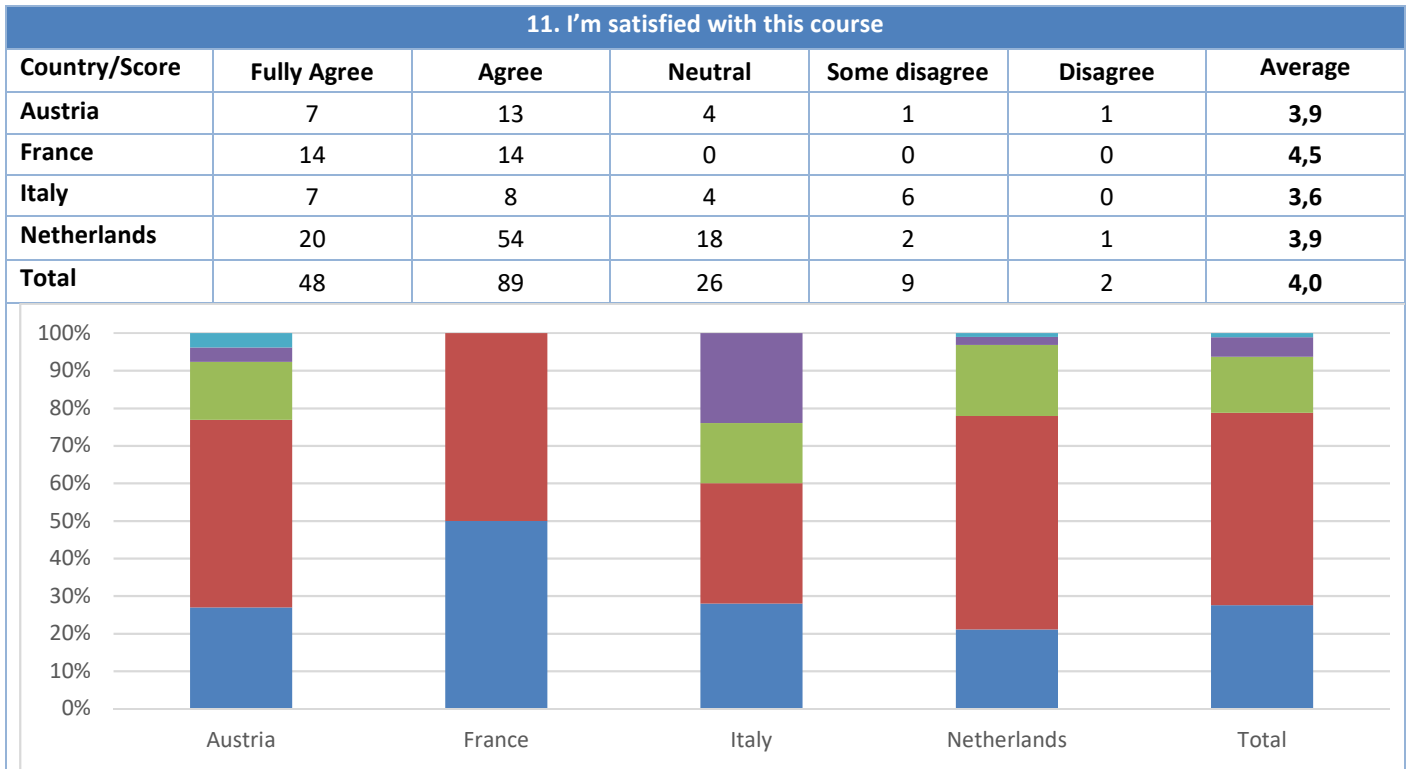
Considering the questions asked during the assignments, the results from the student survey ranged from 3,4 (Italy) to 4,0 (Netherlands). In total the questions asked in the assignments can be seen as well appropriate (score 3,8).

Considering the tutoring activity, the results from the student survey ranged from 4,0 (Netherlands) to 4,2 (Austria, Italy). In total the tutoring activity during the course can be seen as adequate (score 4,1).

Considering the satisfaction with this course, the results from the student survey ranged from 3,6 (Italy) to 4,5 (France). In total the students were well satisfied with the course (score 4).

4 Conclusion

Following the full-scale training of 231 students, 174 satisfaction surveys could be collected. The results weighted according to the number of responses, can be seen in the table below. Considering the overall satisfaction with this course, the results from the student survey ranged on average from 3,9 (Italy, Netherlands) to 4,2 (France). In total the students were well satisfied with the course (score 4).
